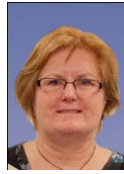

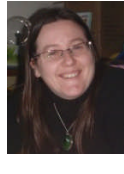

UNION COLLECTIVE AGREEMENT

- An excellent new Union Collective Agreement, with all provisions protected or improved.
- Union representation restored in university committees, including reclassification panels, UAPC, Sustainability Committee and appeals panels.
- An historic workloads clause that applies to both professional and academic staff THAT ensures all workloads must be measured, sustainable and breaches will now be appealed.
- Significant improvements in conditions for casual staff (academic and professional) THAT must be identified, measured and paid for and access of conversion to fixed term or continuing positions.
- Commitment to substantial development support for indigenous employment and participation in decision making structures (such as research, teaching and learning).

ORGANISATION ON THE GROUND

- An established delegates' network ensures better communication with members and providing a point of contact for when members need support. The RMIT NTEU delegates' network is the envy of other branches around the country.
- Increased membership in the last term, the highest increase among all Victorian universities.
- Development of a unique Case Management System, which ensures that members' issues are handled efficiently and escalated to campaigns when needed.

FUTURE PLANS

Moving forward we will:

- Ensure that the changes in the new Union Collective Agreement are fully implemented as soon as possible.
- Support and develop the delegates' network further, especially to formalise protocols of engagement between delegates and the branch and its members, and to ensure that delegates are recognised within the university in their roles as NTEU representatives.
- Foster discussion of higher education policy in light of the Bradley Review and the mission-based Compacts, which are about to be established, ostensibly via a consultative process.
- Begin discussion and preparation for the next Union Collective Agreement.
- Develop case management skills so that other branch executive members and delegates may (optionally) participate in assisting with members' issues.
- Establish working parties including: T&L to address concerns such as misuse of CES; Research; and Promotions.
